## La Maison des Sciences de l'Homme et de la Société de Poitiers

La Maison des Sciences de l'Homme et de la Société de Poitiers (MSHS) is one of the 23 Maisona des Sciences de l'Homme, or MSH, which dot the national territory of research. Founded in 1996, it is an essential link in the research system at the University of Poitiers, by federating 15 research laboratories in human, economic and social sciences.

# Who are we?

Under the twofold supervision of the University of Poitiers and the CNRS (Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique), attached to the national network of MSH, the MSHS of Poitiers is a Service and Research Unit (USR) attached to the InSHS-CNRS; it offers a space dedicated to research and researchers, services dedicated to the implementation and enhancement of their work. The MSHS also hosts 3 doctoral schools.



The MSHS pursues 8 main objectives:

- > Structure Human and Social Sciences research
- around four axes
- > Promote interdisciplinarity and develop projects (role of incubator)
- > Build and lead strategic projects
- > **Enhance** the activities of the MSHS and of the 15 federated laboratories
- > Develop partnerships with the socio-economic world
- > Relay in order to deploy and anchor national devices
- on the territory: TGIR Huma-Num and CVT-Athena

- services > Work towards international visibility

# What do we do ?

The MSHS is the scene of interdisciplinarity: both a favorable meeting place and a lever in collaborative projects' construction. As a research unit, it is running its own research projects, which are strategic for Human and Social Sciences. As a service unit, it offers tools and also human and technical resources, allowing integrated laboratories to carry out their projects and facilitate their ambitions.



The scientific research is structured around four thematic axes:

### > Language and Learning: corpus, cognition, genesis of works

The central question of this axis concerns the relations between language and thought with three programs: analysis and development of the lexicon, production and relationship between oral and written language, emotion and language production. This axis involves the use of technological tools to digitize, to record reading and writing activities, but also to evaluate and accompany deficiencies.

#### > Risks and Vulnerabilities

This axis brings together researchers in social sciences who examine three levels of analysis: macro (regulation and politics), meso (company, organization) and micro (individual behaviors and indicators) with four programs:

- financial risks and new regulations,
- markets, cultures and societies: the processs of commodification of culture and practices of consumption and daily life,
- preservation of the autonomy of seniors,
- risks related to water.

### > The Boundaries of the Body

The question of the body is becoming increasingly important. The axis considers it both as a social and as a cultural construction, and also as an object of desire and violence. Three themes, at the turning point of history, literature, medicine, psychology... were selected:

- Body and comics,
- Mistreated bodies,
- Images and staging of the body.

### > The emerging axis: mobility, intercultural dynamics and endangered heritage

This new axis considers identity issues related to mobility. The fields of law and politics are considered, as well as anthropology. Three programs:

- Cultural diversities and constructive alterities,
- Minors' mobility,
- The question of tangible and intangible heritage and the role of Unesco is also considered.



As part of the 2015-2020 State-Region Plan Contract, the MSHS provides leadership, coordination and financial management of the Social, Economic and Cultural Innovation in Changing Territories (INSECT) research program.
